

The Paddy Carroll Tjungurrayi (PCT) Tribute Collection comprises 13 significant artworks including four classic Western Desert style paintings, three experimental paintings and two experimental works on paper, all featuring traditional elements. These are accompanied by four major collaborative paintings with Campfire Group Artists – Richard Bell, Joanne Currie, Michael Eather and Laurie Nilsen. During late 2002, the PCT Tribute Collection was exhibited in Six Coats of Black at FireWorks Gallery and then toured the following year with the Regional Art Galleries Association of Queensland. In 2005, the collection returned to FireWorks Gallery in Stratton Street for an exhibition. The PCT Tribute Collection will be exhibited for the first time in 15 years in February – March 2020 at FireWorks Gallery in Thompson Street, Bowen Hills.







Paddy had long been interested in developing some experimental styles with the brush and began a new series. Although his energy levels were limited he completed five new works on linen and paper.




